

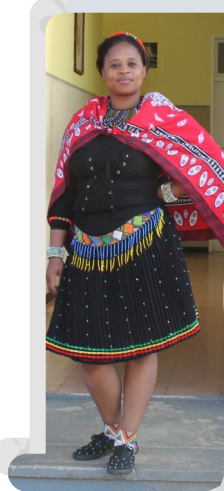


HERITAGE DAY COMMEMORATION
