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A human milk bank is a service that screens, collects, processes and distributes human breast milk. The recipients of the breast milk are vulnerable pre-term and sick babies and special cases where mothers are unable to supply sufficient milk for their babies. This milk has been donated by volunteer breastfeeding mothers who are not related to the recipient babies.

Human milk is easily digested by a premature baby. It provides immune factors that protect the baby against infections, allergies & illnesses. Breast milk provides all the nutrients babies require to grow in the first 6 months of the life. Human Milk Banks are a safe way of providing safe breast milk to babies who need it the most. The World Health Organization (WHO) has recently asked countries to promote the safe use of donor milk through human milk banks for vulnerable babies. Breast milk donors were given a special recognition by the organising committee since they were the key players in ensuring that the event becomes a success.

The launch was supported by Harry Gwala Health District Office, Ubuhlebezwe Municipality, Icebolethu Funerals and Match. Mrs N. C. Ngubo (Assistant Manager Nursing –

Maternity and Paediatrics) who is the manager of the breastfeeding portfolio was the programme director for the event. Mrs Maseko (Chief Executive Officer) welcomed all members present and then Ms Shezi (PHC Manager) introduced the guests. Ms K. Social Worker Solves a Long Standing Social Case

Christ The King Hospital Social Worker, Ms S Dlamini managed to solve a long standing social case at the paediatrics ward on the 26th of September 2023. The client had been admitted since birth.

The client Miss Lungiswa Fika, born on the 11th of April 2022 by illegal immigrants from Lesotho was admitted as a lodger in the ward after she was badly abused by her biological mother and later abandoned with the biological father. The father is from Mphathi Village, Qacha's Nek (Lesotho). He currently lives in Shayamoya informal settlement in Ixopo.

Ms Dlamini traced the paternal grandmother and other relatives a few months after her appointment to the hospital. She interviewed the biological father who loves his child dearly but his living condition is not conducive to raise a child. He works long hours at the

forestry, thus cannot take fully custody of a toddler. The social worker managed to trace the paternal grandmother who lives in Mphathi Village and is willing to take in the child. The biological mother's contact information provided on the patient file were constantly on voicemail. She could not be reached as to concur to her child being taken by the paternal family. She has never visited her child ever since she was admitted, only the father was present.

The grandmother wants to take the child under her care and is willing to come to South Africa to finalise the adoption process. On the 26th of September 2023, the father and the grandmother of the client came to the hospital to fetch the child, it was a very emotional experience especially for the paediatric staff since they have been with the child for over a year.

Ever since her appointment at the hospital, Ms Dlamini had managed to solve long standing social cases especially for illegal immigrants. She creates positive change in the lives of individuals, families, and communities. By fostering collaboration, empathy, and empowerment, her approaches enable clients to overcome challenges, build resilience, and enhance their overall quality of life.

Special Recognition To Dr Ntumba and Medical Team

The quality department would like to give a special recognition to Dr Ntumba and the rest of the medical staff for going an extra mile in saving a patient's life.

Dr Ntumba and his team showed an act of dedication, commitment and bravery when he decided to go with the EMS staff transporting a patient who had Eclampsia to Harry Gwala Regional Hospital on the 8th of November 2023. Eclampsia is a rare but serious complication of preeclampsia. Preeclampsia is a disorder of pregnancy in which a person who's pregnant has high blood pressure and protein in their urine. Eclampsia is when a person with preeclampsia develops seizures (convulsions) during pregnancy.

Dr Ntumba and his team were given a certificate of recognition by the quality assurance department on the 29th of November 2023 during the medical staff morning meeting.

PSI and Hand Washing Training at Ixopo EMS

The Monitoring and Evaluation team visited Ixopo EMS for a Patient Safety Incidents and Hand Washing training on 27 October 2023. The purpose of this training was to assist Ixopo EMS in reducing the number of PSIs they receive. Mrs Getyengana (Clinical Programme Coordinator - Quality Assurance) trained staff on how to overcome PSIs and how to handle report and solve them once they have been reported.

A Patient safety incident is an unplanned or unintended event or circumstance that could have resulted or did result in harm to a patient while in the care of a health facility. This event is thus not due to the underlying health

condition or natural progression of disease. An incident can be a near miss, no harm incident or harmful incident (adverse event).

Mrs Zondeka (Clinical Programme Coordinator - IPC) then explained the importance of hand washing especially for the EMS staff. She then demonstrated how to wash hands. The EMS team was very responsive and were willing to learn.

Cerebral Palsy (CP) is a group of disorders that affect a person's ability to move and maintain balance and posture. CP is the most common motor disability in childhood. Cerebral means having to do with the brain. Palsy means weakness or problems with using the muscles. CP is caused by abnormal brain development or damage to the developing brain that affects a person's ability to control his or her muscles.

The Cerebral Palsy Party is an event held annually by the Rehabilitation Department to commend caregivers and patients who have been compliant with therapy throughout the year and to reflect on their progress and skills gained. The purpose behind the party is to encourage and reward adherence to therapy. The party will also help create a positive lens for the patients to view therapy through, which should assist with further adherence.

The theme for World Cerebral Palsy Day in 2023 is **"Together Stronger."** This theme highlights the importance of unity, collaboration, and mutual support within the cerebral palsy community and beyond. It emphasizes that when individuals, families,

caregivers, and communities come together, they become a powerful force for positive change and inclusion.

The day sheds light on the need for increased awareness, understanding and support for those with cerebral palsy.
