Thulisile welcomed the health employees at the rank and stated that as a woman she supports the initiative and she would also encourage other ladies that should follow suit and donate. She then alluded to the fact that since her work environment is dominated by men whom are fathers they should support their partners to breastfeed and those who are willing to donate to do so.

Speakers who also took the stand in support of the initiative were Mrs. P.C Mbatha who works at the District Health Office as (MNCWH), she shared with colleagues and members of the community the importance of breastfeeding and donating of breast milk she further stated that although the bank will be based at Dundee Hospital it caters for the whole of UMzinyathi District. Colonel Nyide from the Dundee SAPS representing the security cluster wing, said they are also in support of the initiative, he stated that "this initiative is a poverty alleviating approach which will limit incidents whereby reports of women and young girls are reported to be caught red handed shoplifting in local shops and supermarkets trying to steal to feed their starving children at home".

"Umzinyathi District have launched the 14th Human Milk Bank in KZN today since the declaration made in Tshwane in 2012, over million Mili-liters have been pasteurized ever since and 711 Children have benefited from the donated milk, children whom are fed breast milk have been proven to be smarter and weights accordingly", Mrs. Z Mtshali said.

Mrs Z. Seme Dietitian from Umzinyathi District Health Office encouraged and pleaded to the community present to kindly cascade the information received from the Launch by discussing and talking about it on all possible platforms they can get. She again pleaded with the Health professionals to again utilize platforms from all levels be it Hospital Boards, Clinic Committee Meetings, Public platforms for the Public Relations Officers, War Rooms, Churches etc.

She also stated that "this initiative is for the people as i remember where we hosted the very first encounter with the community of Kwa-Sithole where a Community Dialogue was about and for the people. 5 December 2016 it was when communities firstly heard of this Human Milk Bank (thing) attendees were very inquisitive and very concerned at first, which to us as the Department of Health it served the purpose to engage with the community and be able to give responses. Community engagements continued through the whole of Endumeni Sub Districts where the 8 Primary Health Care facilities are based (Rorckesdrift, Elandskraal, Douglas, Sibongile, Sithembile, Glencoe and Wasbank)

Ms. S Simelane from Dundee Hospital Maternity the Human Milk Bank Coordinator .stated that as the Hospital they do not own the bank and the bank is not only for Dundee but the Hospital are custodians and have been entrusted to host the bank for the whole district, on that note she continued by alluding to the controlling measures and protocols which will govern and guide the processes of donating and issuing of donated milk to beneficiaries. She took the whole house through the screening processes that a potential donor mother has to undergo in ensuring that no infections bypasses the screening processes hygiene protocol.

Mothers were encouraged to use Primary Health Care facilities at their disposal to enquire more about Human Milk Bank and on how they can donate and even donate in those clinics and he Hospital will collect the donated milk from the clinics to the Bank.

Ms. Simelane was delighted to present 6 donors who have already enrolled into the donors list and will be starting to support the bank and making a valuable deposit of the breast milk, these donors were also presented with goodies from "MADE BY MOM" (mugs, t-shirts and umbrellas)
