n an agreement that the Department of Health and Al Midaad Foundation entered into represented by the HOD for Health Dr. M Gumede and Mr. A Chohan is solely based on the foundation to assist in alleviating the social and health challenges that the province experiences and to FastTrack the Cataract backlogs encountered by the province. Through the office of the Kwa-Zulu Natal Premier the Programme has obtained the blessings and will be rolled spread via Operation Sukuma Sakhe throughout to the needy communities. The obligation of these parties (Department of Health and AL MIDAAD foundation) from its commencement is to ensure that items such as: assistive devices. blankets. groceries, medical, eye health services, and surgical instruments and medical circumcision equipment's are received as donations of course having adhered to the appropriate channels and time frames, the delivery of Eye Health Services will be done strictly and closely monitored by the department

Umzinyathi District is amongst the fortunate Districts to be in the receiving line of the benefits from this agreement, as the Al Midaad foundation their partners visited at Dundee Hospital in April with the sole intention to assist and volunteer a cataract program in this District and to address backlogs in patients who requires cataract surgeries as the program aims at performing 100 000 free cataract surgeries in ten (10) African countries.

The main purpose of the current Turkish delegations in KwaZulu Natal will be to meet with the officials from the Department of Health, Air Mercy Services and other relevant stakeholders in South Africa who will help to facilitate the envisioned volunteer driven cataract program, the delegation will also inspect hospital theatres at McCord's Hospital and other relevant locations such as Dundee Hospital and to finalize the logistics of the cataract surgery program.

The delegation visit at Umzinyathi District was ushered by the District Ophthalmologist Eye Care Service from the District Office Mr. S Gwala who took the delegation the Hospital theatre and all the way through Eye Clinic and showed the delegation the machinery and the Eye Department team as well.

mpathe Clinic Outreach Team teach mobilized sector departments to the Child Protection Awareness drive that was focusing on schools. This year, the focus is on Oral health, child abuse (victim to physical, sexual or emotional abuse) and exploitation as well as giving awareness on social ills that may affect the growth of school pupil.

The team led by a passionate health professional Mr. .Ayanda
Hadebe elaborated that every year National Child Protection Week is held
in South Africa annually to raise awareness of the rights of children – their
primary objective towards the 2018 is to ensure that children are well
safeguarded and they are given the deepest health care at their early
age to prevent health risk associated with their health while at school.

Ms Lungile Mahlobo – Dundee hospital oral health practitioner demonstrated the best oral health practices that can benefit the well-being of children to Dundee school learners and teachers. "Teaching children proper oral care at a young age is an investment in their health that will pay lifelong dividends. It is important to help children protect their teeth and gums and that alone greatly reduce their risk of getting cavities," added Ms Mahlobo. She further taught them to brush teethes twice a day and explained that using a tooth brush alone is a good thing to do. She said even those don't afford to buy toothpaste they can continue brush

On the other hand Ms Kgabo Lephena – Ward Base Nurse told learners to report sexual abuse at the nearest police station. She further advised learners to avoid being the victims of any abusive behavior – be it sexual abuse at home, emotional abuse or any potential abuse at school. She encouraged learners to take action before it's too late.
