### **Breast cancer awareness**

#### WHAT IS CANCER

Cancer is a disease where the body cells grow abnormally, out of control in a body part where it is not supposed to be. The cells that make up the heart, lungs, kidneys, muscles and skin are all quite different.

When these cells are uncontrolled and damaged, they start to grow in an abnormal way and form a lump called a **TUMOUR**.

Cancer can affect men, woman and children, young and old, rich and poor. One not gets cancer from someone else or transfers it to others. With new methods of treatment that is being used many people recover from it.

One can have cancer anywhere in the body part including the bones, skin.

#### HOW DO ONE KNOWS HAS CANCER


If you have one of the following problems for over three weeks and it is not getting better with ordinary treatment, seek medical attention by visiting a doctor or a clinic.


#### On breast self- examination

- Retraction or indentation of nipple

## **Breast cancer awareness cont**

### How breast cancer is identified by the doctor

Firstly the doctor collects the medical history and perform physical examination then use various methods to find out if it is cancer

The methods include:

Biopsy- a small piece of tumor is cut out and examined under a microscope to determine the type of cancer.

Endoscopy- A medical procedure where a doctor puts a tube- like instrument into the body to examine internal structures

CT scan or MRI scan: The instrument takes many pictures of the body from different angles. These pictures are combined to give detailed picture of internal organs

Mammogram: is the special type of x-ray to detect breast cancer

Bloods markers: sometimes cancer cells can be detected in the blood

## HOW DOES THE DOCTOR DECIDES WHAT TREATMENT IS BEST FOR ME

The doctor decides what treatment is best for

an individual based on investigation findings.

- The doctor thinks about few different things before he chooses the best way to treat your cancer.
- What type of cancer
- How big the cancer tumor is
- How fast the cancer is growing
- Whether the cancer has spread to other parts of the body, and if so, where it has spread and how far it has grown in these other places

Your age, symptoms and general health **How do I cope with cancer?** 

**Shock** is often the first reaction when a doctor tells someone has cancer:

- feel numb
- not believe what is happening
- be unable to express any emotions

ask the same information repeatedly **Denial** 

Do not want to know anything about cancer or treatment

Say that you have not been told by the diagnosis. This is a completely natural reaction.

You may need professional help from a psychologist

## **MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS**

Many people are distressed due to the immediate impact the virus has caused and consequences thereof. Fear of infection, dying, losing family members, stress related to economic situation is very prominent.

Frequent information and rumours from various sources deepens uncertainty about the future outcome of the current situation. Severely high number of mental health related problem is anticipated across the globe mostly the front line health care workers, elderly and employees

with uncontrolled comorbidities.

It is very unfortunate that other people behavior prove to be irresponsible and worse part is, every step one takes either good or bad seriously affects others around and even fetal.

# 16 days of activism @ PHC

As the country went into lockdown and people were expected to remain inside their homes in the efforts to curb the spread of COVI-19 pandemic, reports showed an alarming increase in the already existing pandemic of violence against women and children. In efforts to prevent and address such issues, social workers from Dundee Provincial Hospital together with the forensic nurse, went to the clinics whose areas showed an increase in gender based violence cases.

16 days of activism against women and children awareness campaign was held from the 23 November 2020-24 November 2020 at Sakhimpilo clinic, Siphimpilo clinic and Empathe clinic. The awareness campaign was a success as people's concerns were addressed. Topics on the different types of abuse, signs of abuse, effects of abuse, reporting procedure for abuse cases as well as proper management of abuse cases were discussed.

# 16 Days of activism

On the 9th of December 2020 Dundee Hospital Crisis Centre team which consisted of the Social workers from Lifeline and the institution held the 16 days of activism campaign.

The event was held at kwa-Sithole area, as it was identified that, Kwa-Sithole is a rural area, characterized by poverty, crime and gender based violence issues, such as rape, domestic violence, murder etc

During the identification of the area it was noted that the most affected and easy target group are woman and children. The area has a high rate of unemployment, many due to school dropout. The area is also encountered with high level of alcohol and drug abuse.

The main aim of the event was to conduct an awareness campaign about Gender Based Violence (GBV). Informing the community about types of abuse, where to get help, who are the stakeholders of GBV prevention? Inform the community about the precautionary measures that they can be taken in order to decrease stats of GBV, such as be vigilant to your surroundings, don't walk alone, and don't trust easily or strangers and meet a stranger in a public place.

Mobilization was conducted with



the target group of women and children since they are the most vulnerable group of GBV.













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
