Maternity Staff won the trophy for the best run MCWH
Programme in Umzinyathi District

Developing strategies and implementing them does pay of. Dundee Hospital scooped the Umzinyathi District awards for the Best MCWH run programme 2009. The MEC Dr S Dlomo during his recent visit was impressed with our MCWH statistics as one of the best in KZN. On the 03 March 2010 Dr Simelane, Dr Maiwa and Mr. Langa during their visit were also impressed with our MCWH programme.

Best Practice Strategies implemented by Dundee Hospital to improve MCWH.

- 1. MCWH is one of the District Manager's Mr. JN Mndebele priority programmes. On a monthly basis he monitors and evaluates MCWH. He supports institutions by providing them with essential equipments.
- 2. Dundee Hospital Management supports MCWH with regards to staff allocation, and procurement of essential equipment. The basic essential equipments are available and functional at all the time.
- 3. A good Team spirit exists among doctors and nurses.
- 4. We have skilled and committed staff that render quality services and are not rotated.
- 5. We strictly adhere to MCWH policies, guidelines and protocols.
- 6. The MCWH programme is headed by a champion zonal Matron PC Mbatha who has vast experience, leadership skills and is passionate about MCWH. <u>Passion is the key driving force</u>.
- 7. We have a functional and supportive referral system including EMRS and receiving hospital (specialist service).
- 8. We have a functional high risk clinic with Advanced Midwife and a doctor. The Skilled staffs identify the high risk factors and act/ refer accordingly.
- 9. We fast track HIV positive mothers with low CD4 count.
- 10. Regular monitoring and evaluation is done for PPIP (Peri Natal Problem Identify Programme), and CHPIP (Child Problem Identify Programme).
- 11. Our paediatric ward monitors CHPIP accordingly and manages identified problems such as HIV in children, opportunistic infections, malnutrition, and social problems.
- 12. Monthly perinatal and maternity meeting are held as well as regular clinical audits on the programme. Feed back is given to all relevant stakeholders such as clinic managers, maternity staff and all doctors.
- 13. Our advanced midwives are trained in neonatal nursing science, they mentor other midwives in labour wards, post natal and nursery.
