ADOLESCENT AND YOUTH FRIENDLY SERVICES

On the 31st of October 2017, the South Africa Red Cross society launched AYFS program at East Boom Clinic. The aim was to bring awareness to the adolescents who use the clinic. The AYFS purpose is to encourage more youth to attend clinics. Also making them aware that during a specific hour they will be assisted by the clinic's appointed youth friendly Champion . The South Africa Red Cross society will assist by mobilizing more school children for happy hour sessions that may occur once a week. An appointed Red Cross peer educator will conduct the sessions and discuss which ever topic that he/ she and champion have planned. Sessions will be held to assist in making adolescents that attended the clinic to feel relaxed and comfortable while they wait for assistance from the champion. Topics vary as they aim to bring assistance in advancing the youths lives.

The CANSA Association was part of the launch, they gave insight on breast cancer and showed demonstrations on checking for lumps that are not supposed to be growing in the breasts, this was done in support on the cancer month. WORLD AIDS DAY 2017

World Aids Day takes place on the 1st of December each year. It is an opportunity for people worldwide to unite in the fight against HIV, to show support for the people living with HIV and to commemorate those who died from Aids related illness. Founded in 1988, World Aids Day was the first ever global health day.

Globally there are an estimated 36.7 million people who have the virus. Despite the virus only being identified in 1984, more that 35 million have died of HIV and AIDS, making it one of the most destructive pandemic in history. Today scientific advances have been made in HIV treatment and we understand so much more about the condition. Despite this, each year more people are diagnosed with HIV. People do not know the facts about how to protect themselves and others. Stigma and discrimination remains a realty for many people living with the disease. World Aids Day is important because the disease has not gone away and there is a need to increase awareness, fighting prejudice and improve education. World Aids Day in an opportunity to show solidarity with the people living with HIV. Most people do this by wearing red ribbon, lighting the candle which brings light into darkness of denial and stigma.

On 01st December 2018 the HAST team and supporting partner Khethimpilo presented a hugely successful day. The awareness day took the form of an interactive presentation and songs composed by the staff relating HIV. The community enjoyed the presentation and this was shown by the amount of question pose and their participation in the songs and ululations. Prizes was given for the correct answers.

DISTRICT SERVICE EXCELLENCE AWARDS 2017


