There were various healthcare services being provided by the clinic staff to the attendees of the event, including but not limited to pap smear swabbing, T B AND HIV SCREENING, DIABETIC, B.P, FAMILY PLANNING etc.

HSRC highlighted that they are conducting a Study called BIYELA. The study is focusing to women aged 18-45 years and looking at ways to prevent STI's especially GONORIA. The study is focusing on women who are not pregnant, not breastfeeding but sexual active. **Old mutual** gave financial advise to the audience. They highlighted that one of the easiest way to save money is to join stokvels, piggy banks or put your savings in a 2 litre bottle. Theses are cost free saving methods and you can save any amount you can afford by trying to cut down on unnecessary costs. **AHF South Africa** gave words of encouragement to women, quoting bible verses such as Izaga 14:1, "from women to , it is important to affirm every day, as women you need to be disciplined, love yourself, conveyed love to others and be proud of yourself."
