This specialized room is designed to offer a safe and comfortable space for men who prefer not to share healthcare facilities with the general public. It aims to encourage more men to seek healthcare services by respecting their privacy and preferences. The day was graced by the presence of uMgungundlovu Health district and Municipality, different stakeholders that includes ISIBAYA SAMADODA representatives, municipal officials, government departments as well as the social partners. Dr Khumalo-Dludla was the main speaker for the day. She appealed that all men should know their status and stay healthy. Dr Khumalo Dludla mentioned that

she is one of the programs initiators. She further stated that the program aims to promote men's well-being and alleviate health issues contributing to social ills like GBV, inequality, HIV and STIs. This movement also targets young men and the youth to prevent teenage pregnancy, suicide and high school drop out. The event featured various speakers including traditional healers who play a vital role in society.

The mothers were encouraged exclusive breastfeeding practices to improve child growth and development. Mothers were reminded of the importance of keeping up with child immunizations. The audience consisted of the breastfeeding mothers, guardians, fathers and community members. Harry Gwala Gateway Clinic Operational Manager Sister Phungula welcomed everyone present. She introduced the speaker of the day—Mrs. Zuma. The speaker highlighted how breastfeeding strengthens the bond between mother and child as well as improving overall health outcomes. CHILD PROTECTION PROJECT

Harry Gwala Regional Hospital joined SAPS, government departments, NGOs, and community structures on the 31st of July 2025 to launch a Child Protection Project at Georgetown Library. The focus for 2025/26 was on children in conflict with the law, specifically under the SAPS Child Protection Program.

The background includes that SAPS implements the Child Protection Program at identified stations based on high reports of crime committed by or against children. The program's goal is to collect quality stats data, charge children who are in conflict with the law, and ultimately reduce the number of such cases.

Harry Gwala Regional Hospital representatives highlighted the role that will be played by Department of Health to ensure the success of this project led by SAPS. To name a few:

- CYCLE OF ABUSE WHERE VICTIMS OF ABUSE BECOME PERPETRATOR OCCURS IN 35% OF CASES.
- 51% OF CHILD ABUSE VICTIMS GROW UP TO BECOME ADULT VICTIM OF ABUSE.

It was further mentioned that HGRH is committed to continuing Support of GBV initiatives.

This includes the following:

Dedicated clinical and Medico-legal service to victims of domestic violence and Sexual Offences.

Universal support to child Perpetrator of violence which falls outside of the above.

Universal Psychosocial support services to both groups mentioned above.

We also support other stakeholders such as DOJ, NPA, SAPS, DOE

The launch went very well and was very informative. The Operation Sukuma sakhe approach will assist in investigating the source of the problem, analyzing and supporting the community accordingly.

RENAL AWARENESS

Harry Gwala Regional Hospital, in partnership with the Kidney Bean Care Project, yesterday hosted a kidney/renal health awareness campaign at KwaPata Secondary School.

The Kidney Bean Care Garden Project focuses on the primary prevention of kidney disease through early detection, early intervention, and community education. It is an ongoing initiative that will be conducted annually to mark Mandela Day. The project also places strong emphasis on nutrition, with the aim of ensuring that vulnerable communities gain access to vital health services and information.

This is a collaboration between the government - particularly the Department of Health - and the private sector.

During visits by the Kidney Bean Care Garden Project and the Department of Health to schools, other pressing needs at the schools are often identified.

The awareness talks focused on how to protect your kidneys and the importance of healthy living - not just for individuals, but for their families and communities as well.

Health screenings were provided to all Grade 11 and 12 learners, and those with abnormal findings were referred to renal specialists or nephrologists on site. Further referrals to Harry Gwala Regional Hospital (HGRH) will be made if necessary.

Speakers covered a variety of important topics, including:

Teenage pregnancy, drug abuse, Personal hygiene, Nutrition (dietitian input), Bullying, Gender-based violence (GBV), Social work services, Renal health awareness.

The event was attended by the hospital CEO Mrs. Nelisiwe Nxaba, her executive management team, representatives from private hospitals, Lancet Laboratories, ER24, Bidvest, BW Dialysis Clinics, medical doctors who specialize in kidney diseases, and NGOs.

This project will be sustained annually during the month of July. Mrs. Nxaba quoted: "Your kidneys are your silent protectors. Take care of them, and they will take care of you. You don't need to be rich to live healthily. "Learners, you have the power. Start now, while you are still young. Protect your kidneys, and live a




