According to OSS, field workers must profile communities and acquire information, which is then debated in ward war rooms. Interventions are then coordinated by the

ENGAGEMENT ON EXPANDED PUBLIC WORKS PROGRAMME RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION GUIDELINES.

The Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP) is a government initiative designed to create job opportunities, sustainable livelihoods and skills development for poor and unemployed people. The primary focus is on labour intensive methods in construction and infrastructure related programmes. EPWP was launched in 2004.

A policy paper from Kwazulu Natal's Department of Health attempts to draw attention to important concerns involving participant recruitment and selection for the EPWP program. This policy paper serves as guidelines on participant recruitment and selection procedures for the Kwazulu Natal Department of Health.

The CEO of eDumbe sub-district is Dr. TH Ndlovu. Invited external stakeholders included council members from eDumbe, traditional leaders, municipal leadership, and other departments to participate in

discussions regarding the Department of Health's recruitment and selection guidelines in Kwazulu-natal. The District Director, Mr. SV Vilakazi, along with his staff from the district level graced this gathering.

The recruitment of EPWP participants was thoroughly examined, with the requirement that it be an equitable and transparent procedure that complies with the procedures that oversee it. These procedures include the Youth Employment Accord of 2013, the Ministerial Determination 4: Expanded Public Work Programme, Notices No. 347, and the Code of Good Practice, Notice No. 129 issued by the Minister of Labor in teams of the Basic Conditions of **Employment** 1997. This discussion further included overview of the roles and responsibilities of all parties.
