WORLD BREASTFEEDING WEEK



Many women choose to breastfeed their babies due to the significant health benefits found in exclusive breastfeeding for both the baby and the mother. Any amount of breastfeeding has positive effects and the longer a child is breastfed for, the longer the health benefits will last for both baby and mother.

Breast milk is the ideal food for infants. It is safe, clean and contains antibodies which help protect against many common childhood illnesses, it also provides all the energy and nutrients that the infant needs for the first months of life, and it continues to provide up to half or more of a child's nutritional needs during the second half of the first year, and up to one third during the second year of life.

Literature tells us that breastfed children perform better on intelligence tests, are less likely to be overweight or obese and less prone to diabetes later in life, Women who breastfeed also have a reduced risk of breast and ovarian cancers. This year's 2023, World Breastfeeding Week theme "Let's was make breastfeeding and work, work!" which necessary emphasizes actions policymakers, employers and colleagues support continued exclusive breastfeeding in working women to their infants. The aim is to promote awareness regarding the importance of optimal breastfeeding in infants and measures to support working women in successfully completing exclusive breastfeeding.

eDumbe sub-district dietetics team hosted a series of events commemorating World Breastfeeding Week involving other components within the CHC such as Physiotherapy, maternity, nursing staff. The team was targeting all women with a purpose of educating them and also creating awareness on the importance breastfeeding. More than 400 people benefited from this campaign.

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH



The incidence of breast cancer among South African women is increasing and it is one of the most common cancers among women in South Africa. It is the most prevalent cancer amongst white and Asian women and the second most common cancer among black and coloured women.

Early detection of the condition can lead to effective treatment and a positive prognosis. About 90% of patients survive for many years after diagnosis when breast cancer is detected at the early stages. Regular self-breast examination and regular mammograms are key to early detection. Presenting yourself early for treatment may result effective in more

treatment, leading to a reduction in pain and suffering and a significant decrease in the loss of life.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month reflects a nationwide drive by public and private healthcare structures to raise awareness of this debilitating disease across all races and class structures.
