TRUCK STOP CLINIC LAUNCH

n Thursday, 20 July 2006 a Truck Stop Wellness Center was launched in Kokstad. The Truck Stop Wellness Center is an initiative by the Department of Health and Partners.

Mrs. Ludidi, MP and Chairperson of the Health Portfolio Committee, Mrs. Mabusela- Deputy Mayor Greater Kokstad Municipality; Mrs NS Radebe- Sisonke District Manager, Dr KN Khuluse- Medical Manager Usher Memorial Hospital to name but a few were among the delegation that witnessed the Launch.

The National Bargaining Council for the Road Freight Industry (NBCRFI) introduced the concept in 2000 to educate and create awareness about the spread of HIV/AIDS among Truck Drivers.

This Partnership has afforded Truck Drivers an opportunity to conveniently access healthcare services free of charge. The clinic started its operations in June and it targets mainly Truck Drivers and Sex Workers. An average of 40 patients are seen per day, this is complementing the Department of Health's drive to fight HIV/AIDS and related illnesses.

"we cannot go to Community Clinics because our Trucks cause inconvenience, so with this Wellness Center I can assure you that we are going to live and maintain healthy lifestyle just like all people. The Center will also give us all the information and awareness about HIV/AIDS and we are going to share that with collogues and partners" said Mr. Clement Mthwane, Truck Driver from Mtubatuba.

The center is manned by one Professional Nurse and one Community Health Worker. Hours of operation are from 17:00 till midnight everyday.

Making a written complaint

If we have been unable to resolve your concern, and you wish to make a written complaint, you can do this by

'How to lodge a complaint?'

- Using one of 'Written Complaint' forms and placing it in the Suggestion Box
- Writing a letter to the Public Relations Officer

What we will do after receiving your complaint

- We will acknowledge your complaint within 5 days
- We will carry out a thorough investigation
- We will send you a full response within 25 days. If we are unable to complete the investigation within 25 days, we will write to you and tell you the reason for the delay. We will also tell you when we expect to respond
- We may offer you a meeting to discuss your complaint
- You can expect open and honest answers to your questions and where needed, an apology
- We will tell you what action we have taken as a result of your complaint
