SISONKE CELEBRATED WORLD AIDS DAY

The 1st of December is celebrated around the world to educate and commemorate World Aids Day. Sisonke District Municipality wasn't left out this celebration as they hosted its own world aids day at Bhongweni Stadium under Greater Kokstad Municipality. All municipalities under Sisonke were part of this magnificent day so as other sister department. Department of Health was another major stakeholder on the day because of the services that we rendered.

The most important part of the day was the attendance of the KZN MEC for Agriculture and Rural Development Mrs Lydia Johnson who did the keynote address on the day. Her main concern was the latest statistics that portrayed KwaZulu Natal as the province with more people living with HIV. Her speech was more educational and encouraging especially to the youth not to engage themselves on sexual activities. She also emphasized that there are other ways to fight HIV like elimination of poverty because people are ending up taking wrong sexual decisions because of poverty. That was also her main focus when she was doing home visits around Kokstad. MEC Johnson also gave an opportunity to listens to some of the concerns by the public especially on the subject of the day which was HIV AIDS. Most people raised problems like many taverns around schools as another driver of HIV spreading. She concluded by saying that joint fighting by all government departments, NGO, traditional leaders and the community can reduce the number of people living with HIV AIDS.
