86 clients were seen and 57 were females and 29 were males.

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## HAND HYGIENE CAMPAIGN

- On Thursday 16th May 2019, Emmaus Hospital participated in the World Hand Hygiene celebration by performing hand hygiene activities in all departments.
- The IPC Coordinator (Sister K. Dunne) planned hand washing activities to be conducted by the clinical and non-clinical departments. The Operational Managers were tasked to ensure that the hand hygiene activities were conducted on the World Hand Hygiene Day in their relevant departments.
- All wards and Departments participated and conducted in-service training on the importance of the hand hygiene practice and the utilization of the alcohol hand spray to prevent the transmission of micro-organisms, that contribute to cross infections and responsible for Health Care Associated Infections (HCAI's).

The activities planned for the World Hygiene Day 16th May 2019 were as follows:

- 1. Conduct in-service training for hand washing and hand rub demonstration to all Health Care Workers in every department.
- 2. Conduct in-service training for hand washing and hand rub demonstration (public hand wash) to all patients/clients and visitors in all the clinical areas.
- 3. Hand Hygiene Audit done using the Hand Hygiene.
- 4. Pledge of Commitment– each and every Health Care Worker to sign a Pledge of Commitment to Hand Hygiene.

Number of Health Care Workers trained including Clinics were 306, number of Pledges signed by Health Care Workers: 306 and the number of patients/clients and visitors trained were: 421.

Busingatha and Amazizi Clinic identified a gap in the attendance of male patients in the clinics. Research was done and it was found that the number of males who do attend the clinics is very low.

On the 24th and 25th of May all male clients were called to attend the Imbizo dialogue to find the core issues that prevent males from attending the clinic. The males stated various reasons that stop them from attending clinic. Namely, the long waiting hours and they also want to be serviced by male nurses.

As agreed upon in the dialogue the first Men's Health Clinic was held on the 21st of June 2019 at Obonjaneni area. Services rendered were as follows: MMC, VCT, Cancer Screening, TB Screening and most of the services rendered were rendered by male nurses. We would like to thank our supporting partners (BSSP, HST and JHPIEGO) who made the programme a success and we wish to extend the programme to the whole of Ukhahlamba Municipality.



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#### **SHE CONQUERS CAMPAIGN**

On the 28th May 2019 the office of the premier held the "she conquers" campaign at Emamfemfetheni Community hall under the theme "*if she conquers we conquer*". The aim of this campaign is to tackle the high levels of HIV infection, provide increased access to sexual and reproductive health information and services through adolescent and youth-friendly facilities.

There were learners from Bambazi and Mavimbela High School who took part in the dialogue between the youth and adults of Emamfemfetheni. The dialogue was aimed at the above mentioned issues and coming up with possible solutions. During this programme, parents were also taught on how to talk to their teenage girls and boys about their sexuality. "Our parents are afraid of us that is why they fail in talking to us about sex, pregnancy and drugs, they only say boys will get you pregnant and never explain to us in details the disadvantages and also what are the precautions of pregnancy and other diseases we can contract during sexual intercourse" said a learner of Bambazi High School. Various officials of Okhahlamba Municipality and Uthukela Districts were present.

The event was a great success and highly educational for all the youth and adults of Emamfemfetheni community.





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### **DISABILITY AWARENESS DAY**
