WOMEN'S DAY CELEBRATION




2017 marks 61 years since strong, courageous and fearless South African women marched in Pretoria against the discriminative law which forced black people to carry a pass with them at all times.

Since the project started it has produced good results, less relapse rates, an increases in Leave Of Absences (L.O.A) and has created good relationships between Mental Health Care and Mental Health Care User's families.

The family fun day provides a chance to Mental Health Care Users, their families and the MDT to have fun by participating in different sporting activities. The Family Collaboration initiative gives a platform to the Multi Disciplinary Team and Mental Health Care Users families to discuss various issues affecting patients such as drug abuse and Leave of Absence (LOA).
