It must be stated that we are a rehabilitation hospital that admits from the whole province of KwaZulu-Natal. We admit and discharge patients when they have reached that optimum functional level. We admit people with recent neurological and muscular deficits that can benefit from intensive rehabilitation for a period of up to three months, We then review them for discharge or continue in hospital rehabilitation. There are also other patients that we can admit: quadriplegics (all limbs paralysed) with poor social support, people with GCS <=10 who are feeding through a Tube and or breathing through a tracheostomy. We do not admit people with mental health problems. Social problems must be dealt with by the family and community social workers who will assist with proper placement.

In the near future we will be contacting and tracing those families who have abandoned their loved ones. Their loved ones are occupying beds that needs to be given to deserving patients. We all need to take responsibility for our family members who are having physical and mental challenges. To every stakeholder of Hillcrest Hospital we wish you all the Best in 2019.
