

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

A warm welcome to all the colleagues in the Department and readers of our newsletter. We are issuing this newsletter during the very trying times health-wise in the era of Covid-19. I wish to reiterate the basic messages to everyone out there to contribute in the efforts to curb the spread of the disease: Stay at home

Wash/ sanitize your hands for at least 20 seconds Practise social distancing Practise cough etiquette

Use PPE correctly.

Hlabisa hospital management and staff worked hard in the past 5 months gearing themselves for Covid-19. Training was conducted to the hospital and clinics including EMRS. In Big 5 Hlabisa sub-district 3 screening and 2 tracer teams were established while at Mtubatuba subdistrict on 3 screening teams were established.

In terms of infrastructure the facility had no isolation and no quarantine facilities. Through internal engagements it was decided to convert the underutilized MDR TB ward into isolation ward for confirmed Covid-19 cases.

The suspects were accommodated in the sidewards of the medical wards however as the numbers grew, it was not workable to keep them there and pressure was mounting to find suitable accommodation for them. Eventually the recreational hall was sacrificed for this purpose.

The 1st case was among the group of French tourists way back in March and was transferred to Manguzi hospital as there was no isolation at that time. The first admission at Hlabisa was around 6 June, a patient who tested at llembe District who was visiting home during window that was opened for travelling during the lock down. Since then we have been receiving cases and the figures have gone in of 500 for the confirmed cases. Sadly the deaths have accumulated to 7. Staff was not spared from getting infection and it is worrying when health workers get infected even in small numbers.

It is my wish and prayer that God protect all of us, spare our lives if we happen to be infected and take us through the storm together with our families.



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Mtubatuba Clinic Cervical Cancer Awareness



Mtubatuba Clinic held STI/ Condom Awareness on the 12th of February 2020 within the Clinic.

Noting the increasing number of STI's and the reports by female clients that their partners were reluctant to use condoms, then need of hosting such awareness was identified to prevent STI's and encourage safe sex practice.

Stage play by Health workers emphasized on the following points:-

 Importance of using condoms every time engaging to sexual intercourse.

- It's a responsibility for both partners to use condom either man or female as both types of condoms are available not only the man should wear male condoms for safe sex but also female condoms should be used.
- Importance of treatment for both partners.
- Also importance of reporting to the clinic when having signs and symptoms of STI's.

Both male and female condoms were distributed on the day as well as HIV/STI Screenings.

Human Papilloma Virus Campaign

Noting that many woman dies of cervical cancer, which is caused by Human Papilloma Virus whilst there is a two dose vaccine that protects against Cervical Cancer; the department embarked on a massive HPV Campaign from the 11th of February 2020 till 20th of March 2020.

The campaign was targeting young girls doing grade 5 whom for whatever reasons were not vaccinated at grade 4. These girls were given 2 doses of vaccine, while in addition both boys and girls were given td vaccine as well as deworming to grade R to grade 7 at primary Schools.

Massive mobilization was done to all parents requesting them to give concern to Health workers to vaccinate their kids by signing concern forms.

Teachers at schools played a pivotal role in distribution of all the forms to target groups and in ensuring that the vaccination process went smoothly.

We are looking forward to the second round planned for August and September2020.

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
Quality Performance Indicators


Our Quality Indicators for the Period of April2019 to March 2020 are here displayed.


They indicate what our clients are saying about their practical experience while receiving service at our facility is indicating that majority of patients are happy with our service.

In order for the Hospital to face the deadly pandemic Corona Virus which erupted at China in December 2019 and discovered in our KZN province on the 3rd of March 2020, we have put some measures in place to deal with it.

Our response team and tracer teams have been formed to respond to the pandemic.

Response team deals with conducting community screening and testing in our catchment areas.

The Tracer teams are responsible for tracing all the contacts of any identified covid-19 positive case within our catchment area.

Management members are actively involved in Local Command Task Teams to ensure information sharing and ensuring of compliance with the regulations of the lockdown promulgated.

Trainings of all categories of staff within the institution has been done

Identification of hotspot areas has been done.

Community screenings; Road blocks; Community loud hailing; maintaining of social distance and monitoring of compliance by business entities is amongst activities embarked on.

Everybody is encouraged to Stay at home unless it's an important need that compels one to get out of home.

Ensure that there is a distance of 1 and a half meter between people; ensure proper wearing of cloth masks as well as adherence to cough and sneezing etiquette.

Quarantine and isolation beds have been identified and are being used within the hospital.
