### Hlengisizwe CHC commemorates World Hand Hygiene Day

Hlengisizwe CHC commemorated World Hand Hygiene Day on the 14 May 2020.

Dr NN Mdluli, Chief Executive Officer welcomed all attendees and thanked them for gracing such a prominent campaign with their presence.

She explained that the World Hand Hygiene Day 2020 marked importance of us as the world to go back to basics of hand hygiene as we are faced with COVID 19 pandemic.

Mrs Z. Naidoo, IPC Co-ordinator highlighted the purpose of the campaign as to bring awareness and sensitize health workers and patients about importance of hand hygiene to protect themselves from infections.

The theme of the campaign was, "SAVE LIVES: Clean Your Hands". Mrs Z. Naidoo, IPC Co-ordinator gave a talk on hand hy-

giene. She encouraged the guests to wash their hands frequently with water and soap to prevent spread of infections.

She in-serviced Health Workers on five moments of hand washing which entail before touching a patient, before clean/aseptic procedure, after body fluid exposure risk, after touching a patient and after touching patients surroundings.

Dr B. Sikhakhane and Dr P.B Moodley demonstrated hand washing and SHERQ team demonstrated hand spray.

The staff of Sphanabantu Cleaning Company demonstrated terminal cleaning of the isolation room for COVID 19 suspect cases.

SHERQ Team conducted an audit in the facility after the campaign to ensure that the staff is complying with hand hygiene protocols.

MNCWH staff and Mr K.L Tshabalala from

Pharmacy entertained the audience with sweet music promoting hand washing to contain the spread of infections including COVID 19.

The quiz was conducted by Mrs Z. Naidoo to test attendees' understanding of delivered messages and precious gifts were given to winners.

# Hlengisizwe CHC fights COVID 19

**H**lengisizwe CHC has implemented measures in the facility and at its satellite clinics to contain the spread of COVID 19.

The aim of these measures is to protect the staff, patients and visitors against this pandemic which has infected and killed lot of people around the world.

The COVID 19 Outbreak Meetings are taking place on Mondays to discuss COVID 19 Guidelines and Protocols All categories of staff which entail private companies have been in-serviced.

Yellow lines were marked on the main entrance which are 1,5 metre apart to ensure social distancing among the patients. Only certain number of patients allowed access at a time and they leave 1 chair in between.

All people are only allowed access to the facilities when they are wearing masks. All visitors are registered, screened and triaged on a daily basis in order to be able to trace contacts should the need arise.

Wards for fast queue and isolation have been identified with required equipment and devices for COVID 19 suspect cases.

The facility embarked on a community engagement whereby it trained Warooms on COVID 19 pandemic. Posters were displayed in the community areas and pamphlets were distributed to bring awareness.

Hlengisizwe CHC Mobile Teams embarked on a COVID 19 Mass Community Screening and Testing in the community, Malls and Shopping Centers.

Mrs Z. Naidoo gave a talk to Hammarsdale and surrounding Pastors at Power of God Assembles on COVID 19 after the government reopened churches under strict regulations to contain the spread of COVID 19 in their churches.
