# COMMEMORATING WORLD RABIES DAY THROUGH VACCINATION

The Ilembe Health District in partnership with Ilembe District Municipality, Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, commemorated annual Rabies day on Friday, 28 September 2018 at KwaDukuza SADTU Park under the theme "Share the message. Save a life". 46 dogs and 1 cat were vaccinated free of charge.

The World Rabies day is annually recognized in September to raise awareness about rabies prevention and to highlight progress in defeating the disease. According to the World Health Organisation (WHO), rabies is a zoonotic disease ( a disease that is transmitted from animals to humans), caused by the rabies virus. Domestic dogs are the most common reservoir of the virus according to the WHO. The District Mayor: Cllr S. Gumede assisted with the vaccinations and urged pet owners to take care of their animals. "Pets must be vaccinated yearly". In conclusion the District Mayor urged departments to take this campaign to other local municipalities. *The campaign was a great success.*
