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n 4 September 2009, llembe Health District conducted the Ethics Seminar for all professionals in the district at Amatigulu Centre. The main focus was on "How to handle conflict between the concepts of duty to serve and the realities of resource constraints and the theme was "Save Lives, Make Health Facilities Serve the People".

Amongst the speakers of day was Ms Manqele from DENOSA, Mr Mthimkhulu from HOSPERSA, Dr Nxumalo who is the Khanya Africa Provincial Chairperson, Mrs R. Khoza and the key note address was done by Rev T. Magwaza. All speakers were speaking in one voice of ensuring quality service delivery, despite the resource constraints.

Professionals like Doctors, Nurses and Therapists signed their pledges/Oaths as a symbol of re committing themselves towards saving lives of our people.

In the past 4 years llembe Health District has conducted the above mentioned Seminar to promote the return of Ethics to the workplace. Participants have been invited from other Districts in Area 1. The focus has always been on examining, the issue of patients rights vs those of workers' with a particular reference to the denial of Termination Of Pregnancy rights to patients who need the service.

The main activity used to address this was a debate by groups of UKZN students of nursing from the Ongoye Campus.

It has been interesting to note that the Pro life values always received more support – this pointing to a serious imbalance between the professionals' willingness to provide the service and the growing number of persons who need it and leave our service outlets without it, ending with illicit backstreet services.

There has been however positive outcomes from the Seminars at professional Nurses at Stanger, Mphumulo and Untunjambili Hospital did take up Training, Stanger Hospital being the first to provide it, followed by Mphumulo Hospital.

HEALTHY LIFESTYLE PROJECT BABY

The project baby was initiated at Qoqulwazi Secondary School last year to 66 grade 8 learners. Health education on teenage pregnancy and its consequences as well as life skills on healthy lifestyle was conducted.

Their parents and other grades were also included in the health education talks. Project was implemented on the 18th of May 2009. Sixty five grade 9 learners were each given a baby doll to keep for at least 2 weeks.

On 25 to 29 May 2009 a mock clinic was set up by school health team. Learners visited the clinic with their babies. Health education on breast feeding, care of the baby, immunization, use of Road To Health Card (RTHC), Vitamin A, minor ailments, personal hygiene, child development, abandoned babies, nutrition, family planning and family support system was provided.

The department of justice and social development visited the school on 27 May 2009 to give support and talked about services offered by their departments. Representative from the department of education was also present to give support to the project.
