People are therefore encouraged to use this clinic for blood testing. The ARV clinic provides the following services, counseling of patients about positive

living, drug adherence, and drug readiness., Treatment of minor ailments, give prophylactic treatment against opportunistic infections, give antiretroviral therapy (ART'S), we also give food supplements and investigation which involves Blood taking, Cervical Smears and tuberculosis.
