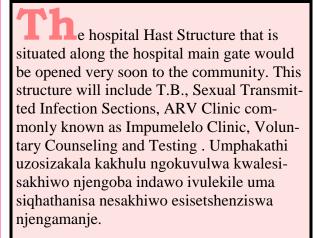

Simelane ongu Hospital Manager esibhedlela Itshelejuba. The highlights of this event was to address the importance of taking full medication of T.B. as instructed by Medical Practitioners in order to avoid Multi drugs resistance that is caused by not finishing the medication. This event was organized by seeing that many people are dying because they are not taking medication accordingly for the period of six months. By seeing that follow-ups

are not done to T.B. patients resulted from the formulation of the tracing team. About 600 people attended this awareness including Dots Supporters . In this Structure the patients will get an opportunity to be advised to go for Voluntarily Counseling and Testing for him or her to know their status and all people with Sexual Transmitted Infections will be treated in this new structure. The medical Practitioners will be available to access all patients who need observations and hospital admissions.
