The minister of KwaZulu-Natal Mr. Zweli Mkhize along with the MEC paid Madadeni Regional Hospital a visit amid the Covid19 spike

Ms. Nomagugu Simelane-Zulu came to inspect the newly renovated nurses home that has been turned into quarantine space for people who have tested positive for Covid19 and suspected cases.

This new quarantine block consist of 20 rooms, with a total of 74 beds

The aim of the renovations and quarantine space is to encourage our community members to come test and not be afraid or stress where they will quarantine, should they test positive. Quarantine will also help reduce community transmission.

The hospital also prepared itself by opening a new ward G9 and G10

G10 is used for Covid positive male Patients admissions

G9 is used for Covid Positive Female patients and a Flue clinic erected for testing. Radio announcement were created and shared with the public on how to protect themselves in these trying times.

To limit the number of people visiting our facility Chronic medication patients were encouraged to collect their medication at their local CCMD points

Abusekho Christian radio station offered a slot for a precaution and awareness sessions, the awareness programme was led by our Infection Prevention control coordinator Mr. Maduna

The E-health patient registration started in May 2020. It is a system for patient registration used to capture patient information online.

The system makes it easier to find where the patient is admitted to, if the patient loses their visit card the system enables to reprint the visit.

The system is also able to search patient by

their ID number and does not allow duplicate of ID number. Clerk needs to log onto the system to capture patient details.


