Manguzi hospital was commended for the second time for the best practice in Infection Prevention and Control on the 25th of October 2017 at the IPC Indaba held at Inkosi Albert Lutuli Central Hospital . Manguzi IPC Team initiated Hand Hygiene Program focusing on reducing healthcare associated infections where by the section were given whistles.

These whistles were blown by hand hygiene champions in Clinical and

non clinical units four times a day. Once the whistle has been blown the staff rushes to the nearest hand wash basin for hand hygiene. Sister Mngomezulu (IPC Practitioner) involved Executive and Extended Management which made the campaign a success.

According to WHO, every year, hundreds of millions of patients around the world are affected by health care-

associated infections. than half of these infections could be prevented by health care workers properly cleaning their hands at key moments in patient care. Hand washing with soap and water has proven to be one of the most effective and inexpensive measures to

prevent the transmissions of infections.

Throughout the world we are now seeing an increase in antimicrobial resistance. Effective hand washing practices has been identified as one of the key measures to reduce antimicrobial resistance.
