As we are at our second quarter of the year I would like to express my sincere gratitude to all staff members who have worked tirelessly in ensuring that the hospital performance improves from time to time. The hospital has done extremely well in HIV tests, we have done 7582 and exceeded our target of 6107 for the quarter. About 96% of the clients tested for HIV are initiated on ARV's which greatly boosts life expectancy of our clients. Tracer medicine availability at the pharmacy has always been maintained above 94%.

I would also like to remind our clients to follow the department of health referral system. Patients must utilise their primary health care facilities first before coming to the hospital, as these establishments are free, and are at least visited by doctors every month. Maximal use of primary health care facilities will assist the hospital in focusing on patients who are admitted in the ward, emergencies and referred clients and also decrease the long waiting time in our outpatient department.

The highlights of the day included screening of 45 women for cervical cancer. Such screening is important due to increased number of clients who die as a result of cervical cancer. Female clientsare urged to visit their nearest health facilities for screening of cervical cancer as early detection will assist in curbing the disease.
