## FIGHTING COVID 19 THROUGH WASHING HANDS

ince the government of South Africa declared Covid-19 as disaster, Mbongolwane hospital in collaboration with MSF (Doctors without boarders) made some means to try bend the curve of coronavirus.

Water basins were installed in the entrance of the facility to ensure that all clients wash their hands before entering the clinical areas. Screening tents and help desk was also placed in the entrance. All clients walking inside the facility get screened at the gate. This exercise will help the hospital to immediately identify the suspects and fast track them accordingly. Information broachers, posters and pamphlet petering to coronavirus are accessible at the helpdesk.
