- Clinical support services,
- Public health:
- Leadership and corporate governance;
- · Operational management; and
- Facilities and infrastructure.

Dr Dhlomo said: "National Core Standards are a very useful tool in our quest to improve the level of care that is offered at our public health institutions. We are very proud of what the staff and management of Inkosi Albert Luthuli Central Hospital have achieved. The biggest winner is the public healthcare user. These accolades show once again that nothing beats hard work and dedication. I have no doubt that if they continue in this vein, it will not be long before they are number one in the country!!! Once again, congratulations to all involved."
