On the 31st of July 2024 Murchison District Hospital healthcare workers and PRO visited Sikanisweni High School, as part of an awareness campaign aimed at educating students on crucial topics, sexual reproductive health, drug abuse, complications of teenage pregnancy and HIV&STIs. It was a dynamic day filled with open discussions, from different stakeholders including, Lifeline, WITS RHI, Redcross and Stholimpilo, where they than offered various services such as TB testing, eye testing, HIV testing, psychological counselling, family planning and diabetics screening

Sister Gumbi from Izingolweni Clinic educated the students about the complications of getting pregnant while you are still in school, where she emphasized the importance of education and personal development before considering parenthood. She also encouraged students to make use of the hospital and clinic services. Mrs Shabalala from SAPS addressed the issue of bullying and sexual abuse, amongst learners and in the communities. She stressed that you should not remain silent if you are being sexual abused because they are there for you. She then emphasized the negative consequences you might face as a students who went through sexual abuse.

Mrs. Nokwanele Mazubane, a Social Worker at Murchison Hospital, concluded by encouraging learners to make use of the hospital services including psychological counseling and other health services.
