KZN LEGISLATURE VISIT

During the visit, presentation was made regarding the state of readiness for current global pandemic of Covid 19. **Cold Chain logistics and infrastructure** outlined the then current vaccine stock and storage temperature that needs to compliment the longevity of the vaccines. **Human resources** aspect was reported to curb the unemployment rate faced currently not just as a province but as a country.

From the beginning of the vaccination programme, the delegation was reminded of the first phase of vaccine out roll plan which commenced with healthcare workers were vaccinated at allocated site which was GJ Crookes District Hospital. Second phase was the out roll of 60 years and above vaccination programme which covered the mother facility and its clinics.

Challenges and achievements were however raised during this visit as walk-about were done at the permanent site of vaccination, chapel which is used for entrance and screening of the public entering into the facility as well as the pharmaceutical services department. **Security services** was and is still part of a very crucial aspect in ensuring safety of employees and resources that being utilized at the site.
