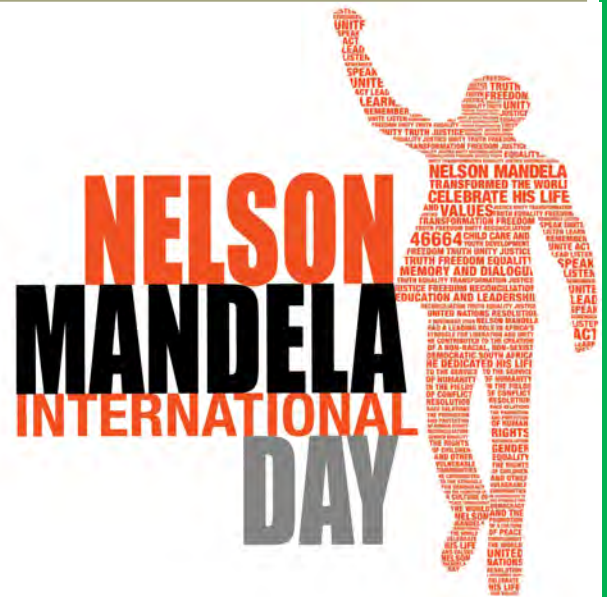

WOMAN'S DAY CELEBRATION

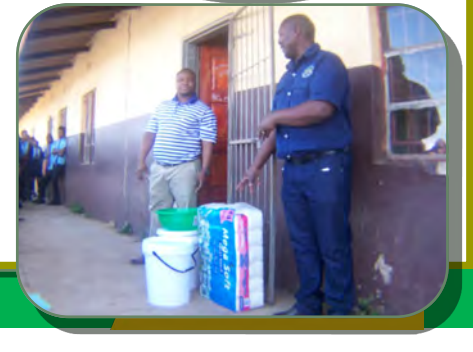
