

The DOH and DPME hosted the COVID 19 vaccination engagement with the Community Health Care workers to get the feedback about hesitancy of the community in taking the vaccine. The session was held at Phoenix Plaza Mall on the 31 March 2022.

Mrs. N. Masondo (DD Clinical and Programs) highlighted the purpose of the day and introduced the visitors. She further explained that the reason why we have such engagements is that it has been noted that the uptake of community members taking vaccine has decreased and also it will be appreciated to get their views /perceptions as they engage with the community on a daily basis. Mr. V. Mthembu who coordinated the engagement session posed various questions to the audience about COVID-19 vaccination. Some of the questions raised was whether the government had done enough to ensure the easy access to COVID-19 vaccine and to ascertain whether the community trusted the efficacy of these vaccines. The CHW's stated that the community appreciates the vaccines effectiveness in fighting this pandemic and also highlighted that there is still more to be done to get the buy -in from the community and to support the programme. In closure Mrs. N. Masondo (DD Clinical and Programs) thanked everyone for participating in such a crucial discussion and will ensure that gaps identified will be attended to with the support from the District Office.
