

### WARNING SIGNS OF BREAST CANCER

- Thickening or swelling of a part on the breast.
- Irritation or dimpling of breast skin.
- Redness or flaky skin in the nipple area or the breast.
- Pulling in of the nipple or pain in the nipple area.
- Nipple discharge other then breast milk, including blood.
- Any change in the size or the shape of the breast.
