The 25th of November 2019 marked the commemoration of the 16 Days of Activism against Women and Children Abuse. PMMH in partnership with Thuthuzela held a prayer where different religions came to together to pray for this crisis the country is facing of gender based violence where we see more and more women and children being abused worse being killed. The event was led by Bishop Mkhize, Chaplain for PMMH and attended by PMMH staff and and non-profit organisations and other government departments

"ENOUGH IS ENOUGH: TOGETHER FAST TRACKING IMPLENENTATION TO END GENDER BASED VIOLENCE" The day was focused on the types of abuse faced by community members on a daily basis and what the victims should do, what services are readily available to them in order to survive this ordeal. Advocate Mafuna from NPA urged victims to utilise Thuthuzela when they're faced with abuse as Thuthuzela is a one stop shop from clinical assessments to law enforcement as there's a SAPS office stationed to assist victims in opening cases. Mrs Madlala, Social Worker from Department of Social Development working at Thuthuzela reminded those that render services to gender based violence victims to be understanding, caring and treat them as humans rather than victims, as they're humans who happened to be victims of a cruel incidences.

Sergeant Shezi, Umlazi SAPS Social Crime Prevention Unit stressed the importance of reporting. The event was closed in prayer by members of different denominations asking for change and a better tomorrow from the current situation affecting our women and children in the country.

The 16 Days of Activism against Women and Children Abuse campaign was closed in high note where PMMH multi-disciplinary team organised a "Peace March" on the 10<sup>th</sup> of December 2019 led by males from the organised labour and different denominations, to encourage the community to break the silence and report gender based violence incidences. The peace march followed the number activities that focused on educating staff and the community on the issues around gender based violence.

The route used saw a number of community members joining in on this call for "no violence against women and children". "We call upon men to bring back peace and calm to our society that is now constantly living in fear not knowing if their children will be next, will they come back from school. It's hard to send them to shops because you don't know who to trust anymore. This need to stop and it's us men who can make a change by standing up against gender based violence" said Mr Ngobese, Chairperson for Nehawu at PMMH.

# **LEARN ABOUT YOUR MEDICINES**

September being the Pharmacy Month, the multi-disciplinary team consisting of Pharmacists, Pharmacist Interns, Psychiatry and Social Work embarked on an outreach programme where they targeted schools and ranks in and around the catchment area to educate and promote the correct use of medicines especially those linked to depression, stress, anxiety and self harm to scholars and the community members given the number of cases being attended too by the Psychiatry and Social Work teams.

Education was on caused of such conditions, symptoms, available medication in assisting these conditions, importance of adherence to prescribed medication by the professional health worker and the type of help that is available should one be faced with such.

What are some of the psychological and emotional signs that you're stressed out:

- Depression and anxiety.

- Feeling overwhelmed, unmotivated or unfocused.
- Trouble sleeping or sleeping too much.
