rince Mshiyeni Memorial Hospital is under the new leadership of Mr Gabriel Khawula commonly known to the department by "Bigboy". He resumed his duties as the CEO as of the 2nd of January 2019. Mr Khawula is no stranger to the department as he has held numerous leadership positions for over 15 years.

He has worked as the CEO for Sterkfontein Psychiatric Hospital in Gauteng from 01 May 2002 - 31 October 2003. He then joined Grey's Hospital in Pietermaritzburg as the Finance Manager from 01 November 2003 - 31 July 2005. From 01 August 2005 - 31 March 2016 he was the CEO for Port Shepstone

Hospital, under his leadership this hospital obtained 100% compliance with COHSASA in 2007. In April 2014 their Thuthuzela Care Centre worm 1st prize in KZN and 2nd prize nationally by National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) then in October of the same year the institution obtained 82% on National Core Standard assessment by the Office of Health Standard Compliance.

He was then requested by the department to act as the CEO for Mahatma Ghandi from 01 June 2014 - 31March 2016 whilst still managing Port Shepstone, he managed both institutions simultaneously. His knowledge, skills and positive contribution to the department resulted in him being nominated in June 2017 by the Minister of Health as a South Africa representative member of General Council of International Hospital Federation in Switzerland and has been part of the development of Ideal Hospital Realisation and maintenance framework.
