Hepatitis virus types A, B, C, D and E cause infection and inflammation of the liver that can lead to severe disease and death.

HEPATITIS A & E

Spread by poor food hygiene, unsafe water and lack of sanitation

The risk is higher in rural areas of developing countries but you can catch it anywhere

WAYS TO PROTECT YOURSELF



Talk to your healthcare provider about the hepatitis A vaccine



Cook food well and eat it while it's hot. Avoid raw shellfish and raw meat



ALWAYS wash your hands with soap and water after using the toilet,

changing a baby's nappy and before preparing food and eating



Peel fruit and vegetables, wash salads in clean water



Only drink safe water

HEPATITIS B, C & D

Spread by blood, semen and other body fluids

WAYS TO PROTECT YOURSELF



Talk to your healthcare provider about the hepatitis B vaccine



NEVER share needles, razors or toothbrushes



If you are pregnant, talk to your doctor about how to prevent transmission to your baby



Use only sterilized tattoo and piercing instruments



Use condoms correctly and consistently



Where possible, choose oral medications instead of injections

GET TESTED!



YOU ARE AT RISK IF:

You've ever had medical or dental treatment with unsterile instruments

You've received a blood transfusion in a country that does not test for hepatitis

Your mother was infected with hepatitis when you were born



You are living with HIV

Most of those infected don't know they have it, **INCREASING THE RISK** of developing severe liver disease and transmitting the virus to others.
