Referral Criteria to Richmond hospital from CHC and PHC.

Patients diagnosed with tb, who are stable who need the following

Patients who require rifafour Patients who required streptomycin. Patients with poor social circumstances Patients who need rehabilitation Stable patients who are too ill and weak to take tb treatment at home Patients who need the services of a dietician Patients who need the services of a social worker Patients who need the services of a physiotherapist Patients who need the services of an occupational therapist Patients who need the services of stoma and bedsore care Patients who have are chronic defaulters Patients who need to initiated on arvs

Patients with afb positive sputa, can be referred directly to Richmond hospital by the nursing staff, if they are stable, and no other uninvestigated or uncontrolled medical conditions Patients with ptb that has been diagnosed on chest x-ray and disseminated tb needs to be assessed and referred with a doctor's referral letter, explain the condition.

We do not accept unstable patients. We do not accept md or xdr or tdr patients Patients with uninvestigated problems, we do not investigate problems We do not accept patients who require oxygen or ivi fluid or ivi treatments. Please correct all biochemical or hematological abnormalities before referring patients.

The referral letter needs to contain

The name of the patient. The patient's id no, addresses and phone number The clinic referring the patient The name of the referring nurse and doctor The date of referral How the was diagnosed, when the treatment was started Copies of last available results Other medical problems A list of all treatment that the patient is taking. If the patient is rvd positive Baseline and current cd4 count and viral load. Date of initiation of arvs Current arv. changes to treatment, the reasons why and when need to be documented complications of arv
