Update on Hospital Construction





Earlier this year the Public works portfolio committee visited Rietvlei District Hospital to assess progress on hospital construction. This construction is categorized into three phases. Phase 3a Laundry, Maintenance, Stores, Pharmacy, Waste area, Parking area and Cleaners area with these phases the place will be more. Phase 3b ARV clinic and Staff and Doctor's residence. Phase 3c includes OPD, Administration block, college and transport.

Rietvlei Hospital Management and staff are excited about this project. This will improve service delivery as there will be more accommodation for doctors and staff. The working environment will be conducive, as there will be more space.





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Phila Ma services Offered by Rietvlei Hospital & clinics



Rietvlei Hospital visited different locations around uMzimkhulu with the aim of increasing life expectancy for the mother and children. These visits were done targeting most remote areas where citizens have to travel long distance when visiting the clinic. The service delivery was done in deep rural areas where the infrastructure is not user friendly for health service delivery. The officials have to move away from their comfort zone(normal working conditions) and improvise to make these events fruitful for the clients.

Government buildings such as schools and crèche were used as points of service delivery.

On 27 –28 May 2013, Phila Mah was conducted at magoggo, Ndlovini and Ngqumarheni location under Umzimkulu Municipality. Health education and different services were provided. Some of the health education topics that were covered on this project were: Importance of doing PAP Smears, screening of breast cancer, early detection of malnutrition, Im-



portance of attending ANC early, VCT, family planning, Importance of breast-feeding, TB, CTOP, Male medical circumcision and Healthy life style.

Services for at each site were PAP SMEAR, Minor Ailments, Ante-natal care, Family planning (IUDInsertion), VCT and TB screening, Growth monitoring, Immmunisations, MUAC, PMTCT, Deworming as well as Eye screening. A total number of 265 clients were seen on that day.

The main coordinator for this programme is Assistant Nurse Manager Obstets Gynae & Peads. Local clinics also played a major role in assisting during Phila Mah service delivery initiatives.

Our office (section) is well known as a Patient Administration Office, which deals with administration of in and out patient (clients), by creating new out patient cards to the first visitors of our Hospital.

To ensure confidentiality and privacy of medical records of our clients, we do filling of in and out patients files and collect Revenue according to Fees Manual. Doing admission and discharging of our clients. That is why we always request our Clients to bring their identity Documents or Birth Certificate, Referral letter and contact details especially on their first visit, to ensure that correct personal details are collected and carrier (appointment) cards are made to be available on the next visits. For payments, a letter from Department of Labour or affidavit if you formally unemployed, social grant cards if you are on pension, Medical Aid card if you are on Medical Aid scheme, G111 if you are an employee or self employee.

Since, I came in this position I received support from Senior management,

all patient administration staff and relevant sections or departments in and out of the institution, because up to this far all what we have achieved from their support. We manage to open day and night 24 Hours service in this section, 7 days in a week and 365/6 in a year. We improve admission and discharge. Although we have not yet reached our dream but we still hope that will reach there soon.

Our vision is to ensure that we rendering the best service to our clients (people of UMzimkhulu and surrounding areas) by collect correct personal information, reducing waiting time and complaints.

We increase staff to ensure that the service is not compromised and they are committed in their duties and is a pleasure to work with them, we understand each other and we always want to be the best employees in implementing Batho Pele Principles and not violating patient's rights.




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Ha laa laah Mr Nxele Usebenzile!!!
