GCC

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids. 1.1.
- "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, 1.2. including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

- The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete 7.2. his obligations under the contract.
- The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall 7.3. be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or

 - (iv) the reasons for the restriction.
- These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector. If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 23.7. 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own ments. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or antidumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. 2. SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

2.1 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR

- 2.4.1 It is the duty and responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that his/her staff:
- 2.4.1.1 Presents a presentable image/appearance in full uniform.
