GCC

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (f) Drawspecial attention to certain general conditions a policiable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To exame that clients be familiar with regard to the rispithts and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural. Each divide versa and words in the masculine also mean in the feminine and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of ax t1 bid/quotation/locuments and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a SD existing bird, should be compiled separately for every bird (if applicable) and will supplement the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

1 Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in three blodding documents for the receipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 1.3. "Contract price" means the price payable to the supp Liler under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "Compt practice" means the offering, giving, receiviring, or soliciting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where on enterprise alread is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products intervaling duties.
- 1.6. "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.
- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. "Delivery ax stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock adually on hand.
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means. delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier beanting, all risks and charges involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad imarket its goods on own Initiative In the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries. In the RSA.
- 1.12. "Force majoure" means an event beyond the control. of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foresceable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purch asser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- 1.13. "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to grafter bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14. "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract,
- 1.15, "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, an of/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16. "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractions) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as lending costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1,37. "Local content" means that portion of the bidding priice, which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.19. "Manufacture" means the production of products in the factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19. "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20. "Project site," where applicable, means the place in dicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21. "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22. "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23. "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24. "Services" means those functional services ancittary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25. "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or lany form of electronic or mechanical writing.

Application

- 2.1. These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of delvis, but excluding irramovable property, unless otherwise-indicated in the bidding documents.

Genera

- 3.1. Unless otherwise indicated in the highling documents, the plundage shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.

Standards

- The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications. 4.1.
- Use of contract documents and information; inspection,
- 5.1. The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection thorawith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 52 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in CCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract. 53
- Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser. 5.4.
- The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

Patent rights

6.1. The supplier shall indomnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

Performance security

- 7.1. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the 7.2.
- The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete 73
- The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser, or
 - (b) a cashier's or certified cheque
- 7.4. The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

Inspections, tests and analyses



- If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be 8.2 subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the Department or an organization acting on behalf of the Department, 8.3.
- If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no montion is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the 8.4.
- If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser. 8.5.
- Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier. 8.6.
- Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected. 8.7.
- Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analyzed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Falling such removal the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fall to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchasor may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.
