

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations call parties involved in doing business with government

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and wirds in the inasculine also mean in the leminine and neuter

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation docur ents and hay not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled signarately for every bid (if applicable) and will sup Temerative General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provision in the SC 2 shall prevail.

1. Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding document for the relieipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchas in and the including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by afterence therein.
- 1.3. "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- 1.4. "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of any hing of value to influence the action of a public official in the procure process or in contract execution.
- 1.5. *Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidize 1 by its government and encouraged to market is proposal.*

- 1.7. "Day" means calendar day.
- 1.8. "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.
- 1.9. 'Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually c 1 hand.
- 1.10. "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloads 1 in the splicified store or depot or on the specified site in complete in complete or on the supplier bearing all risks and charge 3 involved until the supplies are so delivered and a valid recomplete.
- 1.11. "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on o an initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the course years which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.
- 1.12. "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and no involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foresectable. Such exerts may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, with some restriction and freight embargoes.
- 1.13. "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procument process or the execution of a contract to the determinant of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after pid submit sion) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competition.
- 1.14. GCC means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15. "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract
- 1.16. Imported content' means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importabilities such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tox or duty the South African place of entry as well as transportational handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.


