- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled so parately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplied to the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provision of in the SC Schall prevail.

#### 1. Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:
