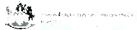

The purpose of this document is to:

- (i) Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, or iteracts and orders; and
- (ii) To ensure that clients be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations call parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the plural and vice versa and wirds in the inasculine also mean in the feminine and neuter

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation docurnents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be a ompiled signardly for every bid (if applicable) and will supplied the General Conditions of Contract. Whenever there is a conflict, the provision a in the SCD shall prevail.

1. Definitions

The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

- 1.1. "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding document: for the re-eipt of bids.
- 1.2. "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchas including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by efference therein.
- 1.3. "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.

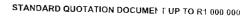
