

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

GCC

NOTES

The purpose of this document is to:

- Draw special attention to certain general conditions applicable to government bids, contracts and orders; and
- To ensure that idents be familiar with regard to the rights and obligations of all parties involved in doing business with government.

In this document words in the singular also mean in the ptural and vice yeas, and words in the mesculing also arean in the fextiting and neuter.

- The General Conditions of Contract will form part of all bid/quotation documents and may not be amended.
- Special Conditions of Contract (SCC) relevant to a specific bid, should be compiled separately for every bid (if applicable) and will supplement the General Constions of Contract, Whenever there is a conflict, the provisions in the SCC shall prevail.

Definitions 1.

The following teams shall be interpreted as indicated:

- "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for like receipt of bids. 1.1.
- "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, 1.2. including all attechments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.
- "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or collecting of any thing of value to influence the action of a public official is the procedement 1.4.
- process of in contract execution.
 "Countervating dulies" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products. 1.5. internationally.

Goods are produced when, litrough menufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is aubetentially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.

- *Force majeure" masss an event beyond the centrol of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or nagligence and not foreseeable. Such events 1.12. may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.
- Praudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to like determent of 1.13. . any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish feld prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the banafits of free and open competition.
- "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract. 11.14.
- 'Goods' means all of the equipmost, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract. 1,15.

Installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gerdening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- "Written" or "an writing" means handwritten in ink or any torm of electronic or mechanical writing. 1.25.

2. Application

- These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services, sales, taking and 2.1. the greating or acquiring of rights, but excluding improvable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply. 2.3. A . 1 . 4

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- Unless otherwise indicated to the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense increased in the preparation and submission of a -3.1. bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tonder Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Beg X85, Pretona 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

Use of contract documents and Information; inspection. ĸ.

- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior witten consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, 5.1. pattern, samples, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchasor in connection therewills, to any person other than a person amployed by the aupplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned to GCC clause 6,3 except for 5.2. purposes of performing the contract.
- Any document, obsertisen the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to 6.3. the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- The supplier shall permit the psychaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors 5.4. appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchases.



- :(a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
 - (i) Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
 - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the buoprinis, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested. 医水平性

- The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under hormal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
