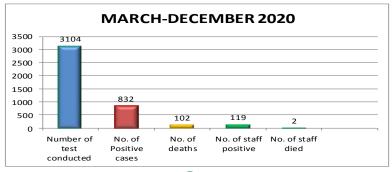
Covid-19 has hit different people in different ways. The hospital had to be ready to manage all patients visiting our facility. A lot of challenges were escalating daily, which forced Management to rethink the scale of strategic and technical organization in order to be ready for the wave. Amongst activities that had to be implemented were:

- ⇒ To train health care workers to be able to identify corona virus vs ordinary flu.
- ⇒ To appointing Team to meet and execute all plans in place
- ⇒ To identifying Flu Clinic which was never on a hospital plan.
- ⇒ To identify one ward to admit all patients under investigation as well as isolated patients awaiting to be transferred.
- ⇒ To embark on self assessment by using set standards
- ⇒ To identify Covid-19 resuscitation area away from other patients.
- ⇒ To form a strong partnership with Organized labour to ensure availability of PPE and other Health & Safety issues.
- ⇒ To formulate a Psychosocial Therapy Committee and Institutional Risk Assessment Committee.

Despite the above plans, there were a lot of lessons learnt which led to more plans being executed. The situation was made worse by lockdown restrictions, where public was unable to visit their loved ones. This led to increased complaints and frustration. The hospital however came up with the strategy of contacting the next of kin on the file on the 2nd day of admission whether condition was improving, changing for the worse or remained the same. This had started yielding positive results as compliments were increasing even if the outcome was bad.

The Hospital Board played a very important role by donating external blinds for the Flu Clinic . This gesture assisted in ensuring that the environment is suitable for all types of weather and is in compliance with Safety and Security standards as well as Patients Rights.

RE: APPRAISAL FOR DR. RAMSAROOP

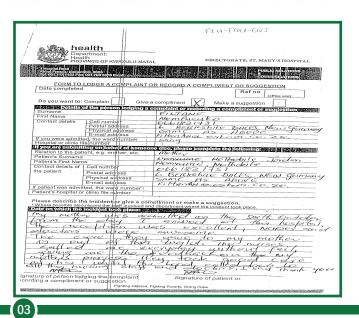

She was so overjoyed when she finally managed to put the tongue back to his rightful place. Our brother was able breathe through the oxygen machine. COVID-19 MEETINGS & TRAININGS

Covid-19 meetings were initially conducted daily to consider the following: Statistics/ Status (National, Provincial, District & St. Mary's Hospital), OHS & Flu Clinic Report, Circulars, Bed status, SCM—stock update, Contingency plan review. Over time everyone understood the principles of covid-19 and all that must be done to protect patients and staff in this pandemic. It was not a normal situation for everyone but the hospital management and staff were able to do everything possible to ensure the safety of everyone. Meetings are currently in place but are held twice a week. What we have achieved is this: PUI ward and Isolation Ward. The facility also identified open space to be Flu Clinic. The area was cleaned and made suitable to accommodate our patients. The place is now beautiful and the patients are very happy to have such a Clinic. Various trainings to learn more about the disease were conducted. Meetings were held with staff to make sure we are all on the same page when it comes to Covid-19 policies. Processes and circulars were shared with all staff. As we are in the second wave the management of the hospital would like to thank the staff for their excellent work even though many of them have contracted the disease but are still working hard.

Following the drill there was a report compiled by the Task Team to write the recommendations and their observations. This report was shared with all staff members for the future reference.

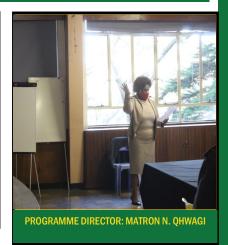

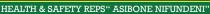


HEALTH & SAFETY TRAINING
