Open Day Event at Tongaat CHC Highlights the Batho Pele Principles.

Community Comes Together for a Day of Awareness and Empowerment

The CHC hosted a successful Open Day event on 4 December 2024, centered around the theme of Batho Pele (People First). The initiative aimed to strengthen the relationship between the CHC and the community by promoting transparency, accountability, and quality healthcare services in alignment with the Batho Pele principles.

Batho Pele: A Pillar of Public Service

The Batho Pele principles, introduced by the South African government, emphasize the importance of putting citizens at the center of service delivery. These principles include consultation, access to information, courtesy, and redress, among others. The Open Day provided an opportunity to showcase how these principles are being implemented in healthcare.

Event Highlights

Uniting the Community Against Gender-Based Violence

Tongaat Community Health Centre (CHC) hosted a powerful and moving event on the 4th December 2024 to mark the 16 Days of Activism Against Women and Child Abuse. The gathering brought together community members, local leaders, and key stakeholders, including the South African Police Service (SAPS) and the Government Communication and Information System (GCIS), to shine a light on the urgent need to end violence against women and children. The 16 Days of Activism campaign, which runs annually from November 25 to December 10, is a global initiative aimed at raising awareness about gender-based violence and promoting collective action to address this critical issue.

At Tongaat CHC, the event began with a moment of silence to honour victims and survivors of abuse, followed by a poem from the registered counsellor from Tongaat CHC and speeches from key speaker, Miss Mlipha (Tongaat CHC Social worker) who emphasized the importance of community involvement and inter-agency collaboration in addressing the scourge of violence. The SAPS Representative highlighted the importance of reporting abuse and shared information on the support services available to victims. "We urge community members to break the silence. Reporting abuse is the first step toward justice and protection," the officer said. The GCIS representative spoke about the government's efforts to combat gender-based violence through policies, campaigns, and support programs. "Together, we can create a society where women and children feel safe and empowered," they remarked. The event organizers urged the community to continue advocating for change beyond the 16 Days of Activism. They emphasized the importance of community vigilance, early intervention, and creating safe spaces for victims to seek help.

importance of exclusive breastfeeding during the first six months, and overcoming common challenges such as low milk supply or nipple pain. Participants were encouraged to ask questions, share personal experiences, and learn from the expertise of the professionals.
