UGU HEALTH DISTRICT VACCINE ROLLOUT WHICH STARTED FOR FRONT LINE WORKERS IS NOW EXPANDED TO THE COMMUNITY

Ugu Health District started with the vaccination programme in March 2021. Vaccination started with phase 1 which targeted Department of Health front line workers which included those from private sector and will now be expanded for phase 2

Vaccination is a simple, safe, and effective way to protect people against harmful diseases, before they come into contact with them. It uses the body's natural defense's to build resistance to specific infections and makes one's immune system stronger. Covid-19 vaccine is given by injection, it is safe and effective.

Phase 1 vaccination programme was a success for Ugu District and will be completed shortly and phase 2 will start on 17 May 2021.

Phase 2 includes essential workers 40 years and above. Residents in congregate, Essential workers include municipal workers. Congregate settings, higher learning, old age home, correctional service and community: 60 years and above which will be the priority for now.

After phase 2, National Department of Health will

start phase 3 which will be targeting 18 years and above. Groups for phase 1, 2 and 3 must make up 67% of the total population for herd immunity to be achieved.

Community need to register on EVDS before receiving the vaccine. This is very crucial as a person will not get the vaccine without being registered. The registration link is vaccine.enroll.health.gov.za, it is available to every phone and the Department of Health is still trying to device other means to register which will be accessible as well for those people who are not using smart phones.

Ugu Health District is working together with the stakeholders for community vaccination programme to be a success. All departments are willing to participate and also assist elderly in registering on EVDS. Registration desks are setup in all areas which include the malls, Traditional Administration Courts, community halls, churches, etc. Community vaccination will also be administered in community halls.



UGU HEALTH DISTRICT HAD A SUCCESSFUL PREGNANCY AND STI AWARENESS EVENTS IN UMDONI MUNICIPALITY



Ugu Health District hosted a successful pregnancy and STI awareness events in Umdoni Municipality at GJ Crookes Gateway Clinic, Umzinto Clinic and Dududu Clinic

Ugu Health District hosted a successful pregnancy and STI awareness events in Umdoni Municipality at GJ Crookes Gateway Clinic, Umzinto Clinic and Dududu Clinic. These events were hosted in different days and were held in February 2021.

GJ Crookes Gateway Clinic hosted on the 18th, Dududu Clinic on the 19th and Umzinto Clinic on the 24th of February 2021.

Giving health education during this awareness, Mr Bonga Ndlovu, Manager for Mother and Child Women's Health at the district emphasized on the importance of early antenatal booking. He said it is very much important for a woman to quickly visit the nearest clinic on her early months of pregnancy to avoid some complications that may happen during the pregnancy. He encouraged women who attended awareness events to bring their partners on board as it is

important to have a person who will support you during your pregnancy

"The community must be aware that sexual reproductive health and choice of termination of pregnancy services are available in Ugu Health District Facilities, that is why it is encouraged that health facility users speak to health care workers so that they get assisted" said Mr Ndlovu. He also emphasized on prevention of sexual transmitted infections by using condoms as they are available for free in every health facilities. If a person identify that s/he is having a problem the clinic must be visited as soon as possible to avoid dangers of untreated STIs. These events were supported by the Programme Managers from the District Office Ms P Mlambo, Mrs N Ndlovu and Mrs T Mathenjwa. Covid-19 precautions were followed and health education talks was also done.
