

Kuqquqquzelwe ukusebenzisana ngosuku lokuqwashisa ngesifo soFuba ngenkathi kunomkhankaso wokufundisa umphakathi ngalesifo. Lomcimbi ububanjelwe ehholo I Qinabout endaweni yase Gamalakhe ku Ward 26. Phakathi kwababethamele lomcimbi kubalwa abelaphi bendabuko, amaKhansela, ubukhosi bendawo kanye nezinhlangano ezizimele ezisebenza ngokubambisana noMnyango weZempilo ukunikezela ngosizo lwezempilo emphakathini.

KZN MEC FOR HEALTH WELCOMING NEW YEAR BABIES AT PORT SHEPSTONE HOSPITAL







Welcoming the new year babies at Port Shepstone Hospital on 1 January 2022, the MEC for Health Ms Nomagugu Simelane accompanied by Ugu Mayor Cllr Phumlile Mtiyane, MEC told people who attended that they must take the opportunity to start afresh, conduct an introspection, and not repeat the same mistakes which were done in the previous year.

On this day the MEC welcomed 33 babies, 14 boys and 19 girls in the Province of KwaZulu-Natal as New Year babies from all healthcare facilities across the Province, the number changed as more babies were born after the MEC's ceremony. The MEC raised concerns as amongst the mothers of the New Year babies, there are young ladies who are under the age of 19. "We therefore can never overemphasise the risks that our girls are exposed to, when they fall pregnant. Not only are they in danger of potentially fatal pregnancy-related ailments, but their prospects of fulfilling their potential as human beings are vastly diminished. We once again call upon parents, guardians, educators and community leaders to have open and frank conversations with their children about the benefits of abstinence and responsible sexual behaviour. "We also re-iterate our call for society to expose and help bring to book any man who impregnates a girl aged 16 and below, because that constitutes statutory rape. We also urge law enforcement authorities to adopt a zero-tolerance stance against this scourge that continues to bedevil our society." said the MEC

MEC emphasized that, it's also a good time to start adopting good habits such as undergoing comprehensive health screening and testing, which can be done at public health facilities, so that people may find out if there are any diseases that are creeping up on them. This ensures that if there are such diseases, appropriate action to stop them from developing further can be taken.

She concluded by wishing every heath care worker a Happy New Year filled with good health, happiness, and prosperity.

Many issues came out during the discussion which

highlighted to the department on why people hesitant in taking the vaccine. The issue of the booster was outstanding as they are many complaints regarding it which are the outcome of the information which was not shared when the vaccine was introduced to people. People who are taking chronic medication are also reluctant because of different reasons as they also access un-verified information from social media
