Mrs. Siphokazi Mabaso has been appointed to act as Ugu Health District Director from 1 May 2021 until the recruitment and selection of the District Director is finalized. Mrs. Mabaso accepted the challenge and responsibility that comes with the post trusting that together as District Health Management Team will continue in providing Health Services as they were guided and led under the exiting District Director. "I feel honored, humbled and excited about the current role as much as it has added responsibility but it gives me courage to take the temporal appointment as from the Lord" said Mrs. Mabaso when asked about how she feels as she now has to lead the District.

Mrs. S Mabaso is not new in Ugu as she joined Ugu District in 1998 as a learner at Sehole Combined School in Harding (Umuziwabantu LM). She proceeded with her Tertiary education and returned in 2006 as a Pharmacist Intern at Port Shepstone Regional Hospital under leadership of Mr. GBC Khawula and Mrs. Ludwig (retired Pharmacy Manager). Mrs. Mabaso returned in Ugu District in 2011 as Pharmacy Manager at Gamalakhe CHC, moved to St Andrews Hospital and then joined Ugu District Health as Manager: Pharmaceutical Services since 2015

She has been a member of various committees in the public sector and was recently appointed as Member of Provincial Pharmaceutical Depot Task Team responsible for Strengthening provision of Pharmaceutical Services in KZN.

When asked about her strength she responded with a smile indicating that "It's comes from God, support from my family, friends and colleagues", she believes in good Governance through by being exemplary in conduct and implementations of the policies and legislative prescripts. UGU DISTRICT VACCINE ROLLOUT FOR FRONT LINE WORKERS AND COMMUNITY IN GOOD PROGRESS



Ugu District communities visiting vaccination sites in numbers to receive their Covid-19 vaccine

Ugu District is doing well with vaccination programme since it has started with health care workers in March 2021. Since that time more than 88 000 people has been vaccinated as other categories were introduced in May 2021.

The department has seen front line workers from other departments coming in numbers in vaccination sites which are in all 4 municipalities. Ugu health has ensured vaccination of other sector Departments (DOE, DSD, SAPS, Municipal workers, DSD etc). On the 16th of May 2021 the vaccination of the 60 years and above was launched. The senior citizens as well as 50 years and above are very excited about this programme. Since we have seen the opening of registration for Izinkalakatha which is a group of 35 to 49, people who are registering to get the vaccine has really gone up. This group is more than being excited in getting their vaccine.

All Ugu vaccination sites are seeing communities coming in numbers, health care workers are dedicated in making sure that every one who visits the sites get the vaccine. Since the number of young people registering is increasing every day, they are requested to assist elderly in registering. People can register through internet, whatsapp or through the sms and this makes easier for those can not access the internet.

Even if the department is doing well with vaccination programme communities must continue stay safe to avoid the increase in number of infections. People must wear musk, social distance, wash hands regularly or use sanitizer, avoid social gatherings where possible. Most importantly those who have tested positive must disclose so that it will be easy for the department to do the contact tracing and follow protocols accordingly.









UGU DISTRICT LEGISLATURE VISIT TO CHECK PRO-GRESS ON COMMUNITY VACCINATION PROGRAMME



On the 8th of June 2021 KwaZulu Natal Legislature visited Ugu District to check the process of vaccination programme. Mrs S Mabaso, Acting District Director led the team to Umdoni and Ray Nkonyeni Municipalities. Their aim as they were visiting all the district were to get the feel of what is happening on ground level and also to get the challenges so they will assist. During the engagement with the district, it was clear that clients are not being turned away under any circumstances, once a person reach the site health care workers assist even if they are challenges. Those who appear on vaccination sites not being registered are assisted as well. Means of trying to reduce wastage of vaccines was also identified in Ugu. The visit was a success and members were happy with all the processes taking place in two vaccination sites that were visited.
