# THE FIRST WORLD PATIENT SAFETY DAY AT UMGENI HOSPITAL



Hospital Entrance (Reception Area)

In response to the call from National Department of Health (NDoH) for all health facilities to commemorate the First World Patient Safety Day, Umgeni Hospital engaged in various activities to highlight the importance of patient safety and pledge commitment to Patient Safety as a Priority.

The activities took place over two days... Starting on the 17th September 2019 which is World Patient Safety Day: Umgeni Specialized Psychiatric Hospital began with decoration of the main hospital entrance, and staff pledging commitment to Patient Safety, by putting their handprints and signatures on a banner. Posters created by various sections of the hospital including private service providers were displayed, and pot plants and flower arrangements incorporated the theme colour ~ Orange. Staff were encouraged to wear orange and black over the two days, and enthusiastically adopted this in a display of orange t-shirts, caps, and scarves.

A bold statement of the Patient Safety Commitment was to paint the tree at the main hospital entrance with an Orange Ribbon, an ongoing reminder to Healthcare Workers as they enter the hospital, of their pledge, and demonstrating to Healthcare Users, the community, and visitors, as they enter the facility that Umgeni Hospital is committed to Patient Safety as a priority.



On Wednesday the 18th September 2019, further activities and a formal programme took place. The local Salvation Army Band led a march from the hospital to a nearby shopping center, and back. The Hospital Patient Band played at the shopping center, wearing orange T-shirts. Members from the Hospital Board and local council wholeheartedly supported the event, and participated in the activities. The local Traffic Department assisted in traffic and crowd control on the day.







Members of the local community also put their handprints on the banner in recognition of World Patient Safety Day.

The march was concluded in a formal programme at which Mrs F. Hlongwane (Manager: Nursing) gave an overview of the purpose of the Day, highlighting the importance of Patient Safety as a Priority. Mrs Carol Kopman (Telecom Operator Supervisor) and Miss Nosihle Zondi (Community Member) presented poems. Other items of entertainment also reflected the theme, including a Role Play and song, by student nurses from the DUT Campus. The CEO Miss NE Ndlovu gave a vote of thanks and appreciated the combined efforts of the staff, students, and community, which made the event the great success that it was.
