UMGUNGUNDLOVU HEALTH DISTRICT BEAT UMZINYATHI WITH FOUR GOALS TO BE THE BEST SOCCER TEAM IN KZN

Umgungundlovu Health District beat Umzinyathi with 4 goals to be the best soccer team in KZN at the recent Sports Tournaments for the Department of Health. On Friday 22 November 2019, a sunny day in Richards Bay Sports Complex uMgungundlovu District soccer team accomplished victory over uMzinyathi District in soccer finals at the annual KZN Health Provincial Sports Tournament .

Under the theme "A healthy and well employee performs better" the tournament is held every year as a way to encourage staff members of all ages and fitness levels to be active in sports. Participating Districts first hold their own tournaments where teams from each health facility (hospital/ Community Health Care Centre) compete with one another; from these teams players are selected to represent each District at the Tournaments in Richards Bay.

uMgungundlovu District held its district tournament on 13 September 2019 where Umngeni Hospital won against Greys Hospital in Netball and Edendale Hospital got first position against Northdale Hospital in soccer.

Thanks to the guidance of Soccer Coach Skhumbuzo Gumede and Assistant Coach Sandile Mkhize that uMgungundlovu came out with guns blazing during the tournament.

At group stages they beat the Provincial Office (Natalia) by two goals to one and were victorious against Harry Gwala District by two goals to nil.

At Semi-finals uMgungundlovu District was well prepared against the well resources eThekwini District and beat them three goals to one, despite both teams being one player short due to red cards.

The win over uMzinyathi at the Finals was a proud moment for all in uMgungundlovu as their first and last first position win during the Annual KZN Sports Tournaments was in the year 2016. The players and supporters were chanting songs of victory after the exhausting games.
